SUU Needs:

- Need for data on urology manpower in private and academic practice
- Need for innovative methods for training residents on new technology
- Need for clear pathway for producing publishable research and literature

SUU Objectives: At the conclusion of this meeting, attendees should be able to:

1. Describe the latest data on urologic manpower
2. Review the latest methods for training urologists and fellows
3. Review best methods for constructing publishable manuscripts

SUCPD Needs: Program Directors and Chairs need to better understand the components of the NAS and the Milestones.
